Goal: Review draft definitions and discuss potential issues.

Proprietary flow-through storm water filtration device: A filter or set of filters (which may include pre-treatment or other equipment and associated piping) that is provided as a defined product by a commercial vendor, and is warranted by that vendor to provide specific storm water pollutant removal performance under specified conditions. These devices can consist of prefabricated equipment supplied by a manufacturer, structures constructed on-site, or a combination thereof.

Proprietary filter media: A defined filter product by a commercial vendor, and is warranted by that vendor to provide specific storm water pollutant removal performance under specified conditions.
